This past year has been a pivotal one for the Highland Park Community Foundation. Through enhanced efforts to raise awareness of the needs in our community and the role the Foundation plays in addressing them, we have made a greater impact than ever before.

Most importantly, we awarded \$200,000 in grants to fund 40 programs that are critical to the health and well-being of the residents in our community. The nonprofits that provide those services depend on our support, and we are committed to filling the gaps in funding to make sure that residents' needs are met.

We participated in numerous local events and meetings in an effort to share our mission with the community. At our inaugural *Gather for Good* fundraising event, a large, enthusiastic and charitable group gathered in support of our community.

Finally, we are honored to have been selected by the City Council of Highland Park to be the fiduciary of funding that has historically been disbursed by the City to local nonprofit organizations to benefit our community. The Council's action is a strong testament to the work we have done over many years to address the needs of our community now and in perpetuity.

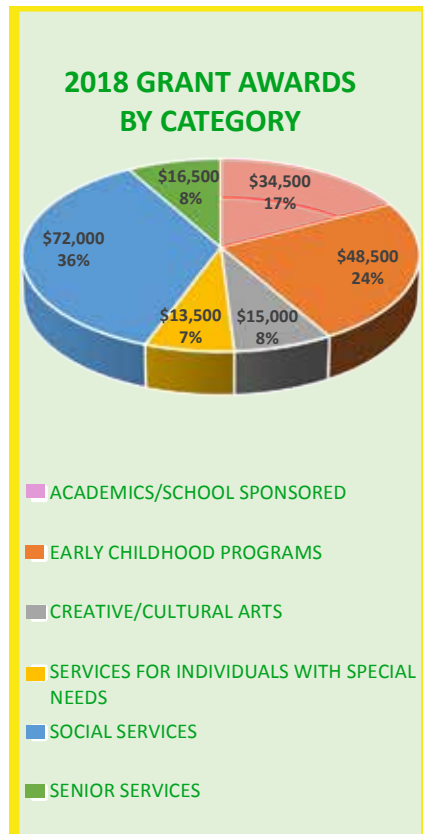

An Impact – Social Services

Many of the needs in our community exist below the surface, making them especially challenging to tackle. HPCF supports organizations that fill gaps for the most economically, psychologically, and physically vulnerable. HPCF's grants in this area include initiatives to address food insecurity, provide access to legal services, and alleviate the suffering of survivors of domestic violence and other forms of abuse.

An Impact – Senior Services

Our senior neighbors carry so much of the treasured history and tradition of our community, while providing irreplaceable connections and perspective. HPCF makes grants to support independence and engagement for this important group, and to keep them involved in the larger community.

An Impact – Education and Enrichment

Education is a fundamental value of our community. HPCF provides critical funding for programs that nurture our community's youngest learners and strengthen families through education. We also support programs that foster leadership skills, and provide important learning and extra-curricular opportunities for students at the high school.

An Impact – Creative and Cultural Arts

HPCF supports programs that provide creative experiences for children and adults and that build community through the arts. We fund important initiatives with broad appeal and help make poetry events, musical festivals, and concerts free to the public.

HPCF supports organizations that work to make our community inclusive and accessible to all. Our grants in this area have expanded to include programs that provide art therapy, respite for parents, and independent living in our community.

By honoring exceptional educators, the Foundation hopes to demonstrate the strength and importance of excellent teaching in helping young people reach their potential. We were delighted to honor **Jon Mall**, Northwood Junior High 7th Grade Social Studies and Academic Exploration teacher, for his outstanding skills and passion for teaching.



Gathered for Good. The Foundation held its first major fundraiser, *Gather for Good*, a highly successful and fun event! We also recognized **Alyssa Knobel**, with the 2018 **Jack Blane Community Service Award** for her outstanding contributions to our community and the Foundation. As the City Council liaison to the HPCF, Alyssa has shared her energy and ideas to make us a better, more impactful community foundation.

Created a New Annual Award. We recognized **Jason Estrada** as the first recipient of the **HPCF Personal Achievement Award**. To meet a need that was brought to our attention, our Board created the award to recognize a high school student who demonstrates perseverance toward personal goals when faced with obstacles or difficulties.

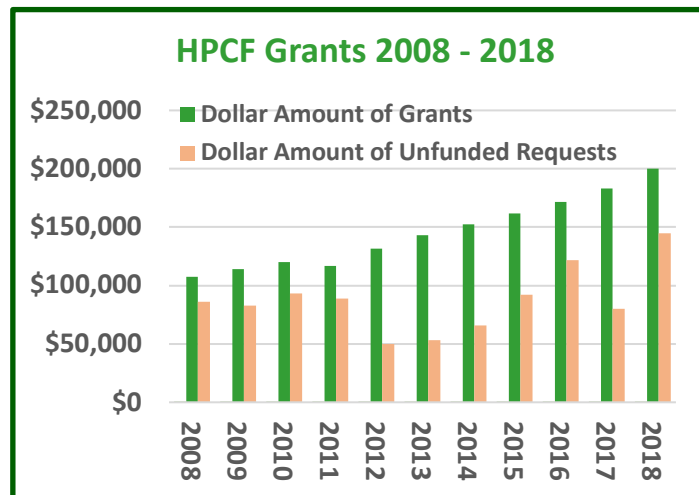
This past year, we distributed **\$200,000** to support **40** programs and services – the highest dollar amount and number of grants we have ever distributed.
