## Information to Help You Protect Yourself and Our Community!

The Community Health Ambassador Program is a Lake County Health Department (LCDH) initiative that was created to support its goal of ensuring that everyone who lives or works in Lake County—regardless of their zip code, race, ethnicity, age, or community—has access to the information and support they need to get vaccinated. As a Community Health Ambassador, we hope to provide the information you need to protect yourself and our community from COVID-19.

## **Vaccine Updates**

Vaccines for Children – COVID-19 vaccination is now available for children 5 and older. The Biden administration secured 1.1 million vaccines for children in ILLINOIS and has worked with pharmacies, community centers, primary care centers, and pediatric offices throughout the country to equip them with the necessary resources to administer COVID-19 vaccines at their facility. You can find a COVID-19 vaccine near you at vaccines.gov.

Booster & Third Dose – The CDC has signed off on the Moderna and Johnson & Johnson (J&J) booster shots, and the mixing-and-matching of the vaccine brands. Eligible people for a booster shot can now mixand-match vaccine brands. Mix-and-match means people can get a booster shot from another USA approved COVID vaccine manufacturer. For example, someone who got a J&J vaccine mid-summer can get a booster shot of J&J, Pfizer, or Moderna. The booster shot dose stayed the same for Pfizer and J&J but is only half the dose for Moderna. See the table below to learn when and who is eligible for a third dose and a booster shot.
