Donations to the Highland Park Community Foundation provide critical funding for programs and services Highland Park and Highwood residents need to thrive or, sometimes, just to survive.

- Through our **annual grants** to nonprofits we address unmet needs in five main categories: education, human services, senior services, services for individuals with disabilities, and the creative and cultural arts.
- We also step up in times of crisis and when there are emergency needs. Immediately after the July 4th Highland Park Parade Shooting, the HPCF formed a Response Fund to support individuals who were physically injured, families of those who were killed, and community members who were otherwise impacted. Just short of 4 months later, we distributed \$5.8 million to victims of the mass shooting and organizations helping them. Eleven months later, we distributed another \$367,000 to local nonprofits to help with continuing shooting-related needs of children and adults. When the Coronavirus outbreak struck, we acted as well. We immediately launched a COVID-19 Emergency Response Appeal and distributed \$240,000 in emergency grants to address urgent needs of residents stemming from COVID-19.

By supporting our work, your foundation will improve the quality of life for Highland Park and Highwood children, teens, families, and seniors. Our community as a whole will benefit as a result.
