Aiming High for Highwood is an annual fundraising and awareness-building campaign, launched in September 2024, that rallies Highwood businesses to support the community's most pressing needs. The initiative aims to foster a spirit of collaboration and generosity, with funds raised benefiting all Highwood and Highland Park residents, many of whom also work in the community. By supporting this campaign, local businesses play a crucial role in strengthening the community and addressing critical challenges faced by their neighbors.

In 2024, HPCF awarded 65 Annual Grants totaling \$873,075 to organizations dedicated to enhancing the quality of life for Highwood and Highland Park residents. As community needs continue to grow, we recognize the importance of doing even more in 2025 and beyond to ensure that the services these organizations provide for children and adults remain strong and accessible to all.
